Following the success of the day, we would like the last Friday of half term to also be a little bit different. Normally Shrove Tuesday falls on a time we are in school, but this year it falls during half term. Once again, in normal circumstances, we would then have a visit from Fr Peter to lead an Ash Wednesday service.
