Abraham was the first person to teach the idea that there was only one God; before then, people believed in many gods.

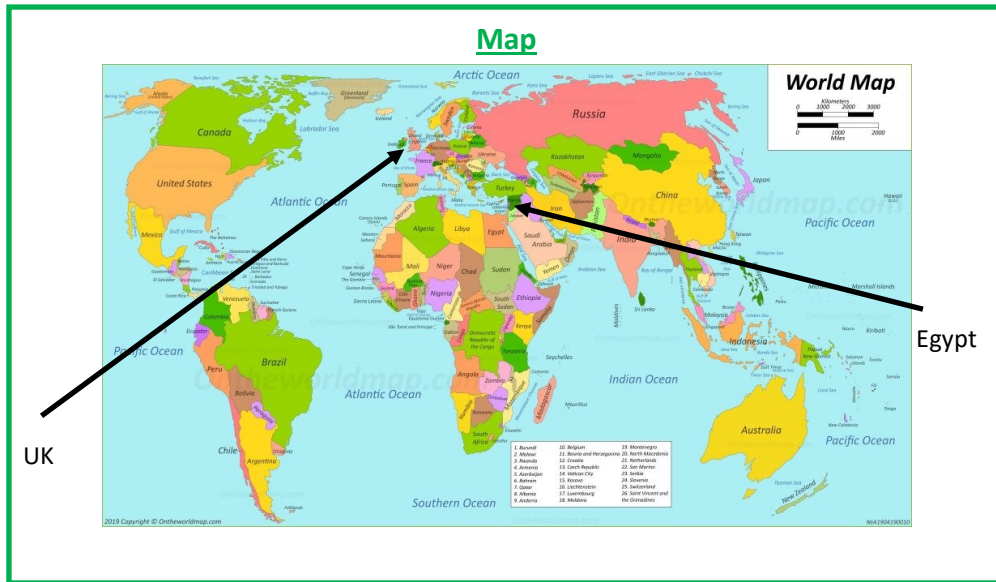
Key Facts

Christian aid and Tearfund are charities that focus on bringing freedom and justice.

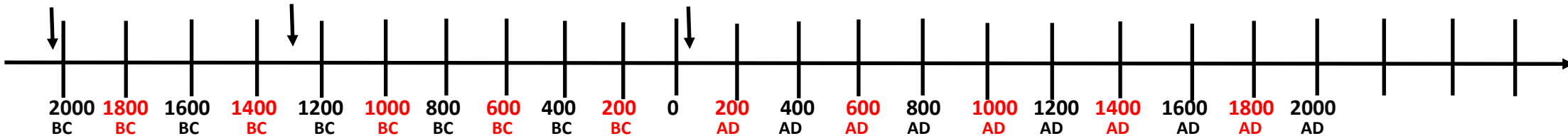


Timeline
