Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back.

We hope you have all had a brilliant summer holiday. It has been brilliant to see how quickly the children have all settled back into their new classes. Little Owls have settled in superbly already and have been busy exploring their brand new classroom with all of its new resources. Miss Webb has done a superb job getting it ready throughout the summer.

Kestrel Class has also had a little makeover with mezzanine area turned into a writing den and reading area. Over the summer an electrician has installed new lighting to the lower half so that it is a better level of brightness for the children. We also ordered some new desks as we predicted some of our Year 2 children would be getting that little bit taller. Unfortunately, the delivery of the desks have been held up slightly, but they should be here in the next few weeks.

A change in staff support means Sparrowhawks now have Ms Capel supporting the class for the majority of the time. They also have Mrs Cork providing additional intervention support on Mondays.

The changes do not stop there with Buzzard Class also benefitting from a visit from the electrician. The board in their room has changed locations and has made the room feel significantly larger.

Over the summer we had applications for some of the last spaces we have in school. Over the next couple of weeks these places will be filled as people move in to the wider area. Once these places are taken, as it stands, it will leave us with space only in Yr 5.

Sticks

Prior to Covid, each new starter brought a stick from somewhere special to them and this was then added to our cross in the entrance hall. With restrictions now largely lifted, could everyone in Kestrels, Little Owls and any other new starters over the last couple of years please bring a stick from somewhere special to them by next Monday. We will then collect these together and add them to our entrance cross.

Coats/Uniform

Please ensure your child has their coat with them - we go outside in the majority of weathers.

It was great to see the children returning with named water bottles. The reception children were







also very proud of their new bags with their names on.

I shared this link at the end of last term. Unfortunately, we have only had 5 forms completed which makes it incredibly difficult to look for patterns in the responses. If you can spare a few minutes to complete the form it would be really helpful as we look at ways to further improve the school.

At the end of last year, our sporting achievements were recognised with the School Games Mark – Gold Award. Not resting on her laurels, Mrs Gammon has been busy overhauling the PE curriculum over the last few weeks of term so that we have an even better offer for the new year. Many of you may not know this, but Mrs Gammon is a former England international hockey player at under 18 level – we would therefore be mad not to tap into this expertise and so hockey will be seeing a higher profile on our invasion games taught.

Please see the following from Mrs Gammon:

From September children in Buzzard and Sparrowhawk class will be learning how to play hockey. All KS2 children will be taught how to play Quicksticks.

'Quicksticks is designed to introduce young people to the game of hockey. It is 4-a-side, can be played on any surface, and uses a larger, lighter and safer ball. It is a fun, fast, safe and exciting game.'

It is strongly advised that participating children wear protective clothing/equipment. Therefore, all KS2 children will be required to have a mouth-guard and shin pads in order for them to participate. Mouth-guards can be bought fairly cheaply from local sports shops or online retailers. Ideally mouth-guards should be kept in trays during the term that hockey is being taught. We have a limited supply of spare shin pads, however we cannot provide spare mouth-guards. Children will not be able to participate without the correct safety equipment.

Quicksticks will be taught from Year 3 until Year 6 and therefore this equipment will be needed every year.

With football also needing shin pads, they are sure to get a lot of use. As many of you will know, we also play a lot of Tag Rugby. Although Tag Rugby is non-contact, the use of a gum shield (mouth-guard) is optional in case of accidental collisions. Sparrowhawks and Buzzards will need both from September.
