

Emperor Claudius invaded Colchester and defeated Britain in 42 AD.


British tribes such as the Iceni tribe, led by Boudicca, tried to defend Britain from the Romans.

54 and 55 BC Julius Caesar attempts to invade Britain twice but fails both times. Boudicca and the Iceni tribe rebel against the Romans.
The Romans win.

Roman rule ends in Britain.
The Saxons soon begin to invade.
