### **Outside Support**

In order to not become blinkered to only what is happening at Bury, we will often seek advice from people outside of our own school. Last week, we were joined by the Teaching and Learning lead for the diocese, Ruth Cumming, to join us as we looked at changes to our teaching of writing. And on Wednesday, we were joined by two other headteachers from the Rother Valley to look at maths across the school. On both visits there were strengths that were highlighted and of course areas where the visitors would do things differently. We will repeat this process over the year so that we can see the impact of the tweaks we are making to our curriculum. Something that shone through on both visits last week was the children's positive attitude to learning and their welcoming nature with all of the visitors commenting on how welcomed they had felt.

### **Phonics Session**

Miss Willett has also agreed to get the weekly cake raffle back up and running. For those of you who were here in 2020, we used to have a weekly raffle where one person baked a cake and raffle tickets were sold on Friday morning by some of our children. At the end of our celebration
