### Swimming Pool Update

As you know, the children's knowledge of the local environment and how to care for it is something that we always striving to develop here at Bury. One such way we do this is through the use of the pond in the wildlife area. Unfortunately, our pond is not brilliantly situated with a lot of leaf-fall and a rather small area. Despite this, the staff still take the opportunity to pond dip and learn about lifecycles with the children - given the space this often has to be in very small groups so that the children can safely access the water. We are also a thriving habitat for toads here at Bury and a regular spot for volunteer toad road crossers at certain times of the year. If only we had a large area of water that could further support the local wildlife and allow us to better learn about the area - the swimming pool. Whilst the ongoing maintenance and size of the pool are not conducive to good use of funds nor adequate to meet the expectations of the National Curriculum, if watertight, they offer an excellent habitat for the children to safely learn. With the conversion of the old changing rooms into an outdoor classroom it also means that all of the necessary equipment is on hand to investigate the creatures that we carefully find. We are incredibly lucky to have a wetlands expert as a parent, Mr Stevens who has talked us through how to make a fantastic habitat for the wildlife and for our children to safely investigate. We will shortly be in the process of relocating the current pond to the swimming pool area and with Mr Stevens guidance, removing some of the invasive plant species that have found their way into the pond.

Thanks to all of the fundraising efforts, this is now at a stage that we can get on and finally make this redundant space, a space that can be utilised by the wildlife and children of Bury for years to come. We are aiming to get the work done as soon as possible so that the wildlife has the maximum time to settle in to its new home and is ready to explore by the summer term.

### Birthdays

For our new parents. Children can wear their own clothes for the day (or a day either side of the holiday) when it is their birthday. Historically, lots of sweets such as small bags of Haribo have been brought in to give out at the end of the day. The sweets invariably produce a huge amount of rubbish and are gone within seconds. Instead we thought instead of sweets that it would be a good idea to buy a book for the school/class. The children then present the book to the school in assembly before placing it in our school library. If there was a message inscribed it would keep reminding the child of their birthday every time either they or a friend borrow the book.
