#### **Exciting News**

At the start of the year, I asked you to watch this space as we looked to redevelop the bottom of School House. Following Mrs Heseltine's move to work for the NHS and us not immediately reappointing the role, it has afforded us the opportunity to look to the future and to see if there is a way we could offer an even better quality of education to your children. As you will know from previous communications, Bury has grown in popularity over the last few years thanks to the quality of education provided by the staff and the excellent support we have from yourselves. Our numbers in older year groups have fluctuated, which has meant changes in class organisation over the years – which the staff team and children have taken in their stride. However, following three years of strong numbers entering the school, we are now in a position that we can start to look forward to establishing a long-term class organisation and structure that will offer an even stronger quality of curriculum offer moving forward.

With all of the above in mind, our intention is to move to a Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 area incorporating Kestrels' current classroom, Kestrels' garden AND the bottom of School House. In order for this to work and to get the benefits of our mixed aged classes, but also being able to enhance the separate curriculums that Reception and Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) need, we have been in the process of recruiting a new teacher to lead the Early Years curriculum and to work alongside Mrs Seymour with Kestrels. We wanted to appoint the new teacher as early as possible so that they could work across the school for the rest of this academic year and really get to know all of the children, the staff and of course our families. It also means they can be involved in developing the space over the next few months so that we are ready to hit the ground running in September 2022.

We were inundated with applications for such an exciting role and were bowled over by the quality of applicants for the position. We are incredibly pleased to be able to let you know that Miss Webb has been appointed and will soon be working across the school, becoming familiar with everyone and working hard to help us to redevelop our new Early Years base in the lower







half of School House.

In addition to redeveloping this space, we are also looking forward to Miss Webb working across the school and offering us the opportunity to provide release for teacher development and also additional intervention work where we have identified need.

# Covid 19

Over the holidays some of the guidance was updated for schools. In full these can be found here <u>Actions For Schools</u> and here <u>What Parents and Carers need to Know</u>

A significant change is in the need to isolate. The following is taken directly from the guide:

Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:

- they are fully vaccinated
- they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

The following is still the case if you suspect your child has coronavirus or has a positive test:

Do not send your child to their nursery, childminder, school, college or to an entry test for a selective school if:

- they are showing one or more coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms
- they have had a positive test result
- there are other reasons requiring them to stay at home, for example, they are required to quarantine







# You should follow public health advice on <u>when to self-isolate and what</u> to do.

The symptoms for children are listed as follows:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

## **Clothes and Water Bottles**

Please make sure you have labelled everything – it is quite impressive how certain items of clothing can end up lost and with more children than ever before here at Bury these items are much easier to locate when labelled. Please also note we have multiple occurrences of children with the same first name so do include an initial.

One positive from last year has been coming into school in PE kit throughout the last year and half has really helped with ensuring the children get more time being active and less time changing – it has also helped with children not forgetting kit. A reminder of what children should be wearing for PE Kit:
