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September 14th 2020

Dear Parents/Carers,

A big welcome to Bruno, Erin and Ophelia who have their first morning with us today. It was great to see them all quickly settle with our youngest Reception children and settle into their new environment brilliantly. Wednesday will see our final 5 new Year R join us and Friday this week will be their first full day all together.

Another thank you to all of you who have done very well at keeping social distances at dropoffs and pick-ups. Unfortunately, late arrivals are causing several cross-overs between the classes which of course adds to the number of people in the area at any one time. We will stick with the same system for the rest of this week and review it at the end of the week to see if a change is needed.

Thank you to those of you who have got in contact early to let us know about potential illness. Please be aware that you/your child will need to be tested should you develop any of the following (regardless of whether you have had/believe you have had Covid previously):

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

We are aware that booking a test at present is proving challenging. Please continue to keep trying and if you are unable to get a test in the first 5 days then the household will need to self-isolate for 14 days from the start of the symptoms.

Tonight the teaching staff are having training on the use of Google Classroom in the event of a localised lockdown requiring online learning for entire classes. For individual cases, the class teachers will be providing links to specific lessons, primarily using Oak Academy online. These will be sent to you via the class email accounts that were set up at the start of lockdown. Please be aware that the teachers are teaching throughout the day and will therefore get the work to you as soon as is reasonably possible. We will not be sending home online learning for usual 48hr illness, it will be sent in the event of a positive case or needing to isolate as part of a household.

Most common questions for school attendance regarding Covid-19

Open Day for prospective new parents

Clearly this is not going to be possible in the same way as we have done previously. The children in Buzzards will not be able to show people around as this would involve them being in close proximity with someone outside of their bubble. We will be encouraging prospective parents to look at the school via the website and to speak to friends and family who know our setting. However, for some new parents to the area they will want to see the school physically to see if it is right for their child. We will be following our risk assessment and showing prospective parents around school by pre-booked appointment only. Parents will not be able to







enter the classrooms nor interact with the children in school. We will continually review this as we do with the entire risk assessment.

Parents' Evenings

Lots of schools are discussing the issue around traditional parents' evenings at present. A lot of schools are making the decision to move to written reports with telephone consultations with the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Coordinator (SENDCo) as required. As we already provide a written report already as part of our parents' evening offer, this is the route we will take unless the guidance changes.

Birthdays

Children can wear their own clothes for the day (or a day either side of the holiday) when it is their birthday. Please do not send the children in with cakes or sweets to share – clearly this is not in-keeping with our Covid-19 Risk Assessment. In its place, we thought that instead of sweets it would be a good idea to buy a book for the school/class. The children then present the book to the school in assembly before placing it in our school library. If there was a message inscribed it would keep reminding the child of their birthday every time either they, or a friend, borrow the book. The link below is an Amazon wish list where the staff and children have selected some books that they would like for school.

It is also great to receive a book chosen by your child because it is something they are particularly interested in.
