Wednesday Sport Coaches

As we rapidly approach half term it means we are reaching the mid-point of the academic year, this provides a good point to review some of the initiatives we have in place across school. Last week I met with the teachers who are released to work on curriculum development at the time that the sports coaches lead the PE lessons. It was amazing to see how much progress has been made across a variety of subjects in these 1hr sessions each week:

- Miss Willett has been working hard on improving science and design & technology across the school a particular highlight being the floorbooks that each class create which really captures the life of learning in the subjects.
- Miss Webb has been spending time reading the evidence around effective history learning in primary schools and is in the process of trialling some new plans to further improve our history teaching.
- Mrs Braun has been using the time to get into classes to see English lessons in action. As a
 response to trying to improving writing outcomes in KS1 we invested in some new resources
 in the autumn term Mrs Braun has been monitoring their impact and will continue to do
 so as the resources become embedded.
- Mrs Seymour has been gaining insight into the children's views of maths lessons. She has
 also been supporting other staff through training sessions which will continue across the
 year. Mrs Seymour is currently working on a 'progression in calculation' policy which will be
 added to our website so that parents can clearly see the next steps in a mathematical
 operation.

The above is just a snapshot of what has, and continues to be, achieved.





Rother Valley

In addition to the teaching staff's own subject improvement, last week we were also visited by the headteachers at Camelsdale and Petworth as part of our locality work supporting each other's school. They came to watch phonics and spelling lessons before meeting with children and staff to discuss how they found the lessons. The feedback was very positive with the children being very articulate as to how phonics and spellings helps both their reading and writing. Another positive was how much the children enjoy the sessions and how much they could explain how they have improved.

Lateness

A reminder that our school day starts at 8:40 with work beginning as soon as the children come into class.

We are also finding a pattern of lateness for collecting children at the end of the day. We are always very happy to support families when we are notified of an exceptional circumstance for a late pick up. However, some families are consistently 10+ minutes late without informing us. This causes difficulties as the staff team have specific things planned after the children. The knock-on effect with lateness then negatively affects other people. Please ensure you are on time to collect your children. Thank you to the vast majority of families who are.
