Torah	A very important book for all Jews containing God's rules.

Jews worship in Synagogues. Men and women usually sit separately in the Synagogues Men are required to cover their heads. In most cases worship takes place in Hebrew.



Jewish people believe the Torah is a very important book, so important, that when they get to the end, they start to read it all over again.


