Ravanna the ten-headed demon tried to take Sita away from Rama. Rama and Ravanna fought a battle and the demon was killed by Rama's arrow.


## **Key Facts**

Diwali takes place annually and lasts for five days, marking the start of the **Hindu New Year**. It is a special holiday for Hindus celebrated with family and friends by eating food, sweets, dressing in new clothes and watching fireworks.

Diwali is a celebration of good winning over evil, light over darkness and knowledge over ignorance.

The story of Rama and Sita is told during the five day celebration of Diwali.

The festival usually honours Lakshmi, the Goddess of Wealth. In India, Hindus leave the windows and doors open of their houses so that Lakshmi can come in.



Rangoli is a pattern created on the floor or the ground using materials such as coloured rice, sand or paint to welcome in good luck.



**Diva** is a lamp made of clay that is lit during Diwali.
