KS2 Production

Like Sports Morning, productions offer children the opportunity to shine in areas they may not get to display on a day-to-day basis. Last year we took the decision to change our traditional Buzzard Class production to be a KS2 production instead. Whilst this was partly led by our small Yr 6 cohort, it was also about being able to offer different shows due to the limited number available for smaller ensembles. Most school productions are designed for 2-form entry schools where Yr 6 alone would total 60 children. Having worked in these larger schools for many years, I know first-hand how challenging it is to get the right balance in ensuring all those who want a part get one, and in supporting those children who do not think they want a part who suddenly have a growth in confidence and find this is an area they can excel.

Such was the positive response to increasing to all of KS2 last year; we made the decision to change to this format moving forwards. This does mean that the percentage of children with leading parts is reduced, but it also means that the children will have four opportunities to be part of a big production. We will review this again at the end of this year.

Whilst your child may not have individual lines in this year's production, their role is still integral. Without all of the roles working together, the production quickly ceases to have impact. Not only do the productions provide opportunities for children to share their talents, it also helps to build teamwork and supporting each other, showing that by working together the whole is greater than the sum of its parts.

Bikeability - FOBS

I would like to thanks FOBS who continue to support our children through funding Bikeability which ensures children in Yrs 5 and 6 develop skills for cycling on single-lane roads and are taught







core functions for safe and responsible cycling.

Everybody Read

It was great to welcome Little Owls and Kestrel parents back to Everybody Read last week. What is particularly pleasing is seeing just how excited the children get at having the opportunity to read with their parents. We do appreciate that not everyone can make the end of day timeslot, but if you can, please do join us.

Reading aloud to your child will have a huge effect on your child's reading age. 'Just Reading' research from the University of Sussex has found that regular reading of a challenging text (beyond the child's reading age) to children has significant gains in the child's reading comprehension. The research found 8.5months progress, with a surprising 16months progress for pupils identified as 'poorer' readers.
