Key facts

Percussion instruments are **musical instruments** that generally are used to establish rhythm. Percussion instruments make a sound when they are struck, shaken, scraped, plucked, or rubbed.

Modern Western classical orchestras include percussion instruments along with stringed and wind instruments.

A wind instrument is a **musical instrument** that uses air to produce sound. The sound is created by a stream of air that flows through or around the body of the instrument. In most cases the air comes from the player's mouth. The instruments are also called aerophones.

Stringed <u>musical instruments</u> make use of a stretched string that vibrates when plucked, struck, or rubbed with a bow. They are divided into categories based on how the strings are attached to the body of the instrument.
