

Brilliant Bury - The Buildings in the village

Key Vocabulary

architecture	How houses are planned and designed. What style of walls, windows, doors and roofing they use.
census	A list of who lived in which house taken every ten years from 1841.
directory	A list of who owned each business in a town or village.
land use	How the land is used and managed: agricultural, commercial, industrial, residential, transport and woodland
material	The matter from which something is made. Houses can be made from brick, stone or wood.
settlement	A place where people live and work.
thatch	A roofing material made of reeds or straw.
timber framed	A building with wooden beams. The walls were filled in with lathe and plaster. These were often built between 1400 and 1600 AD.
terraced house	A row of houses joined together sharing side walls. They allow more houses to be built in an area.



Jessamine Cottage, built in 1390 (the oldest building in Bury) is **timber framed**.



This cottage is made from stone with brick edging.



This converted barn is clad in wood with a **thatched** roof.



Squires Cottages are **terraced** houses

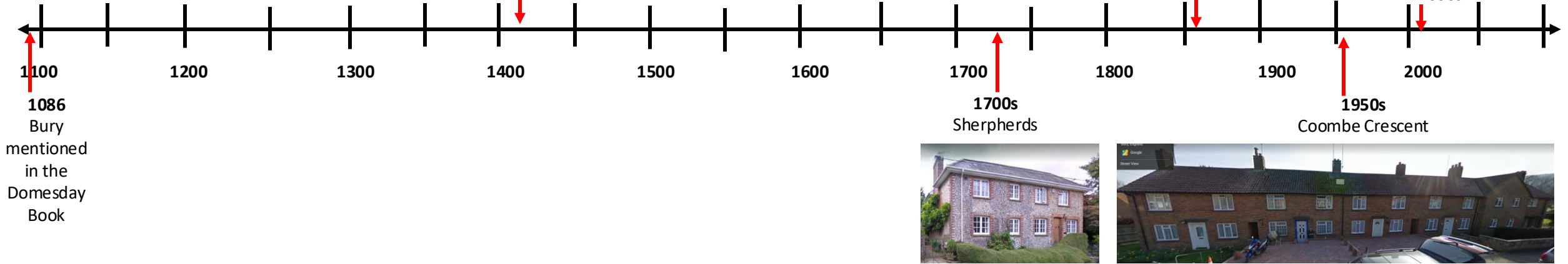
