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Building Work

Some of you will recall that the original plans for Buzzard Classroom included a new canopy for the rear of school. Unfortunately, the cost of the canopy was more than we had available and so we had to remove this aspect from the project. However, Mrs Clark has since been successful with an additional bid for funding and we are now in a position where we are able to move forward with a canopy which will link the original building with Buzzards new classroom. This will provide a much larger covered outside space that will be used by children during break times and by parents at the end of the day.

Rather than waiting for a long holiday period, we are pushing to get this work completed as soon as possible so that we can provided a covered link for the children. The intention is for the work to start on Friday before half term and to finish the week after half term. Whilst I appreciate this is more building work during term time, I believe the benefit of having a dry covered way before the winter is worth the short period of inconvenience.
