Building Work – Starts today (Little Owls will be collected at the end of the day from the same location as Kestrels until the end of term)

Our decarbonisation work with the diocese is due to start immediately after the children break up for summer and is scheduled to conclude in the days before they return in September. As part of the work the windows in the old Sparrowhawk classroom will be replaced and upgraded. To get the most out of this, we will be refurbishing the whole of the old classroom and the small room adjacent to it. This work will start on Monday 30th June. The builders will again be based in the school car park so spaces will be limited. Their main point of entrance will be via Little Owls' garden.

By completing this work now, it means that all of the classes will start September 2025 in a new room to how they started 2024. Kestrels will move into the old Sparrowhawk classroom and Little Owls will move into Kestrels current room. Current Little Owls classroom will be used for interventions, group work and meetings.
