On Friday afternoon we received an impromptu visit from Amanda Elmes, Learning, Outreach and Volunteer Lead for the South Downs National Park. Amanda appeared with a gift for the school as a result of Buzzards' writing in the autumn term.

As Amanda explained just how well the children had done, I asked her if she would like to stay for assembly and to tell the whole school. Amanda was very pleased to be able to share the news with everyone and explained the following:

"I am delighted to let you know that your school has won a KS2 prize for the wonderful work that you submitted celebrating the special species of the South Downs National Park.

I am delighted to enclose certificates for the individual pupils who scored the highest (Maisie, Eva, Arabella and Jesse). Please do pass on our congratulations to them and all the other entries which contributed to your winning score.

Thanks to generous funding from the Foyle Foundation and the South Downs National Park Trust we are pleased to award the following prizes:

- A copy of the Lost Words book (enclosed)
