#### Attendance

At the end of last week, the Department for Education published '<u>The link between attendance and</u> <u>attainment in an assessment year</u>'. Whilst the findings are not a surprise, to see them laid out so clearly makes for a stark reality – the lower your attendance in school, the less likely you are to achieve the national outcomes. Alternatively, more positively, the greater your child's attendance in school, the better chance they have of achieving national outcomes.

"For pupils at the end of KS2 in 2022/23, as the 5% band of attendance during Year 6 increases the proportion of pupils achieving the expected standard RWM increases as shown in Figure 114. Over the entire cohort, the likelihood (without controlling for confounding factors) of pupils with 95-100% attendance reaching the expected standard is 1.5 times greater than pupils with 90-95% attendance and 2.4 times greater than pupils with 85-90% attendance".

Attendance is just one factor that has been looked into. Whilst month of birth has











been a known factor on outcomes, this is the first time historic attendance has been shown to have such a significant impact. Of children with attendance below 90% in Yr 2 **only 15**% achieved the expected outcome at the end of Yr 6.

All compounding factors shared below (IDACI = Income deprivation affecting children index decile; SEN = Special Educational Needs; FSM = Free School Meals)

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As you would expect, there is a similar correlation at KS4 Maths and English GCSE. Only 18% of those children who had attendance below 90% in Yr 6 achieved Grade 5.

## Figure 9 Proportion of pupils in the KS4 cohort who achieved Grade 5 in Maths and English GCSE for compounding factors



"Overall the analysis shows that as the level of attendance in the year of assessment at the end of KS2 and KS4 increases, the likelihood of achieving key attainment outcomes at the end of KS2 and KS4 increases. When controlling for other factors known to affect achievement, such as prior attainment and pupil characteristics, the attendance band has a positive link to attainment."
